



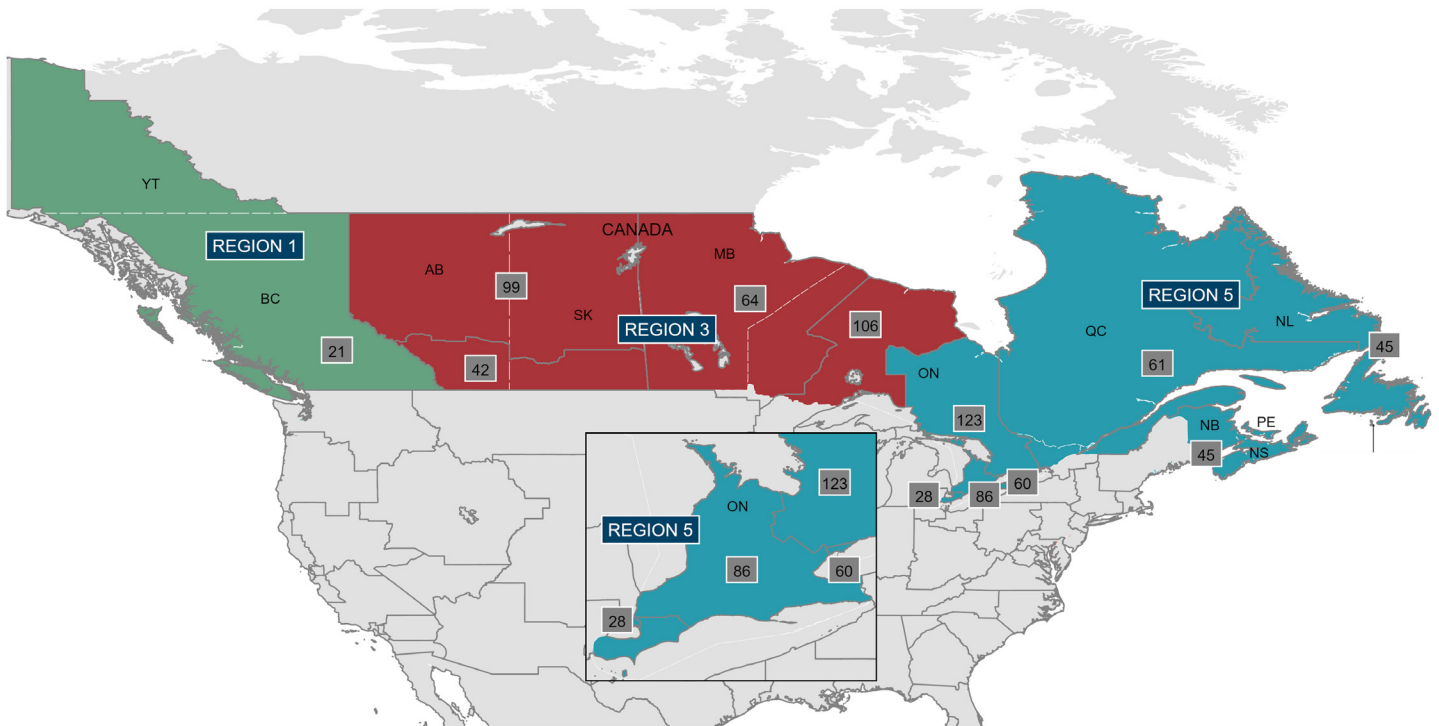

DISTRICT 123 REALIGNMENT REPORT 2025-2026

Members of the District 123 Council,

It is my pleasure to share with you the proposed realignment for District 123 for the year 2025- 2026, included in this District 123 Realignment Report.

This report presents the proposed realignment for District 123 for the 2025–2026 Toastmasters year.

The realignment has been developed to improve service delivery, strengthen leadership capacity, and ensure that divisions and areas are balanced and sustainable.

Key changes include the dissolution of Division M and redistribution of its clubs across the district, along with adjustments to divisions and areas to improve operational efficiency, leadership coverage, and member engagement.

This proposed alignment positions District 123 to better support its members, enhance club quality, and respond effectively to evolving membership trends

The following are some of the highlights of these changes:

Divisions M to be Dissolved, the clubs from division M will be realigned across the district in a manner that will keep members engage and Division and Area Directors to serve clubs in the most effective manner.

One Club have been transfer from Division A to Division N.

Two clubs Transfer from Division B to Division N

Two clubs Transfer from Division C to Division N

Division A Have move from 5 area to 6 areas.

Division C have move from 5 areas to 4 areas

I. Introduction

Further to the requirements of Toastmasters International, each district must review and amend, if necessary, its alignment of the clubs, areas, and divisions once each year. The 2025-2026

realignment for District 123 is subject to the approval of the District Executive Council at its annual business meeting on May 2, 2026. In accordance with this requirement, District 123 Director Michael Proudlock DTM delegated responsibility for developing recommendations on district realignment for 2025-2026 to a District 123 Realignment Committee composed of the following:

Realignment Donald Coore Meet with the group in October and began individual meetings with Committee members in January, 2026. All Committee members participated in reviews of their own and other divisions. Committee members were encouraged to solicit input from their division clubs and members. The District Executive Committee (DEC) was briefed on Realignment Committee progress at the DEC meeting of Saturday, January 21, 2026. A Draft Proposal will be presented to the District Trio (District Director Michael Proudlock DTM; Program Quality Director Madhukar, Club Growth Director Eva Britton DTM) April 15 2026.

The draft realignment proposal may be reviewed by District 123 before the DEC on May 2 2026, following which the final District 123 Realignment Report will be submitted for consideration by the District Executive Council at the District 123 Annual Business Meeting on Saturday, May 2, 2026.

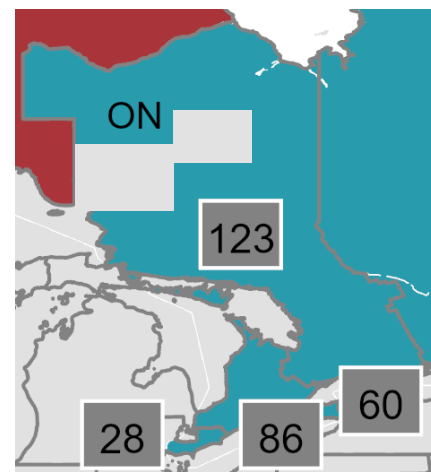
